Day 1

Friday 7th March

Yanacocha

We started early in the morning. I met the group at 6:00 in Puenbo Birding Garden, after some nice birds at the feeders such as Saffron Finch and Scrub Tanager we went ahead to reach the old Nono-Mindo Road. On the way to Yanacocha we saw Black Flowerpiercer, Black tailed Trainbearer, Red crested Cotinga and more. Once in Yanacocha Reserve we took the Inca Trail and had the amazing Rainbow bearded Thornbill sitting on a bush, later on Masked Trogon female, and Barred Fruiteater. We checked the feeders for hummingbirds such as Golden breasted Puffleg, Great Sapphirewing, Sapphire vented Puffleg, Tyrian Metaltail and more. After that we drove a couple of hours more to get to the lower part of Tandayapa Valley. At Alambi Garden we had lunch with a myriad of hummingbirds in front of us: Western Emerald, Purple throated Woodstar, White necked Jacobin, Tawny bellied and White whiskered Hermits, Brown Violetear and some tanagers: White lined, Lemon rumped, Blue Gray and more plus Red Headed Barbet male a female. We stayed overnight in Mindoloma.

Day 2

Saturday 8th March

Paz de las Aves- San Tadeo

We got up early in the morning, it was the rainy season in northwest, so just in case we decided to leave Mindoloma at 5:00 am. It was the right decision as there was a landslide blocking the entrance of the road for the Cock of the Rock lek, we struggled a bit but finally we made it!. There were about 5 individuals displaying and the activity lasted for more than an hour and a half. The journey was then along a trail for an excellent view of a Common Potoo roosting and on the fruit feeders were Toucan Barbet, Crimson rumped Toucanet, Black chinned Mountain Tanager, Sickle winged Guan and on the way back Moustached and Ochre breasted Antpitta, our first two!! Choco Endemic hummingbirds at the feeders were Velvet Purple Coronet, Empress Brilliant, Violet tailed Sylph and more.

After a delicious traditional breakfast we went for our third Antpitta, Chestnut Crowned, just at the side of the road. But to get the fourth one was an adventure - we waited patiently but the call was still far, so Angel and Rodrigo, the Paz brothers, tried from the other side of the mountain, we followed Rodrigo and with all the effort we were rewarded with Yellow breasted Antpitta!. Finally driving out of the reserve we had an amazing view of the Lyre tailed Nightjar roosting.

After enjoying a great lunch at Mindoloma we drive to an area named San Tadeo, we took about 3 km of gravel road for birding, finding species such as Rufous crowned Tody Flycatcher, Grey breasted Wood Wren, Russet crowned Warbler and some more before driving back to Mindoloma for dinner.

Day 3

Sunday 9th March

Milpe

Today we aimed to visit a lower elevation to compare with the places that we were birding on previous days. Milpe Reserve is managed by the Mindo Cloud forest Foundation and was a great chance to find Choco specialities: Club winged Manakin, Choco Toucan, Choco Trogon, besides birds like Chestnut mandibled Toucan, Bronze winged Parrots, Barred Parakeet, Golden Headed Quetzal, Guayaquil Woodpecker and more. Lunch was in the well known restaurant Mirador Rio Blanco, and in front of the window there was Silver throated Tanager, Thick billed and Orange bellied Euphonias and more tanager species. We went back to Milpe to explore a bit of the road and a trail with birds like: Buff fronted Foliage Gleaner, Green Thorntail, Streak headed Woodcreeper, Broad billed Motmot and more.

Later when we were starting to have dinner, we could hear some noise - people from the lodge went to check and called us to see a Kinkajou, eating the bananas off the feeders!. We stayed overnight at Mindoloma.

Day 4

Monday 10th March

Upper part of Tandayapa Valley

Starting with breakfast at Mindoloma, we left at 6:30am for birding in a different area of the Ecoroute. We started to walk and found good species; Powerful Woodpecker, Flame faced Tanager, and Crimson mantled Woodpecker, Ocellated Tapaculo, Plate billed Mountain Toucan, Orange breasted Fruiteater, Green and black Fruiteater...we were ready to have our box lunch on the mountain, and after that we needed to drive back to Quito. We had a couple of hours by car and we stopped nearby the bridge before Puenbo and in just minutes we had Vermilion Flycatcher, Golden rumped Euphonia, Southern Yellow Grosbeak, and White bellied Woodstar. It was then time to go to Puenbo Birding Garden for a great dinner and to stay overnight.

Day 5

Tuesday 11th March

Papallacta pass-Guango

After breakfast in Puenbo Birding Garden and some minutes enjoying the garden for Shiny Cowbird, Cinereous Conebill, Western Emerald female and more, we went along the old Papallacta road, driving slowly. One of the clients spotted a couple of Caraculated Caracara on the fields, this ecosystem is great for birds of high elevation and in fact we enjoyed 4 Giant Conebill, Red crested Cotinga, Stout billed and Barred winged Cinclodes, Andean tit Spinetail, Grass Wren, Tawny Antpitta, Puna Hawk, and even a White tailed deer in front of the van. Unfortunately we tried for the Seedsnipe but it got too cloudy making the conditions not good at all. Back on the Highway, we stopped briefly in front of the Papallacta Lagoon for some shore birds: Yellow billed Pintail, Andean Teal, Blue winged Tail, Neotropic Cormorant, and Greater Yellowlegs were seen.

A few minutes by car and we arrived at Guango Lodge, where the feeders gave us the chance to see Sword billed Hummingbird, Chestnut breasted Coronet, and Collared Inca. We tried near the river for Torrent Duck and there was a family of them - a couple and 2 young males. It was the perfect end to the day. Overnight was at Guango Lodge.

Day 6

Wednesday 12th March

San Isidro

Leaving the lodge at 5:30 am, we drove for about an hour to San Isidro Lodge, at a lower elevation on the east slope. As soon as we arrived we had good views of Subtropical Cacique, Cinnamon Flycatcher, Pale edged Flycatcher, Inca Jay, and Azara's Spinetail. At 7:30 we went to look for the White bellied Antpitta that Guido, part of the staff of San Isidro lodge, feeds with worms; we didn't have to wait too long and it showed up! Then we checked the hummingbird feeders to see a new species during this trip: Bronzy Inca. Later on we drove a little bit and crossed a bridge and had views at the river of Torrent Tyranulet. On the road again we had Bluish Flowerpiercer, Southern Lapwing, Crested Quetzal and more.

After enjoying the great food of San Isidro we drove back taking an alternative way to check a by-pass to Baeza town – we got Russet backed Oropendulas, Smooth billed Anis, Golden Olive Woodpecker, Saffron crowned Tanager and back to Guango again for an overnight stay.

Day 7

Thursday 13th March

Guango

Starting at 6:15 am we were birding at Guango on the parking lot and behind the river was a nice flock of Turquoise Jays, Northern Mountain Caciques, Slaty Brush Finch, Black Crested Warblers, Glossy black Thrush, White capped Dipper, and Pearled Treerunner. We had breakfast, and after that we took a walk for two hours in the Waterfall trail, and got a better view of a couple of Masked Trogons and Green and Black Fruiteaters. At the lodge we took about an hour to get prepared with our bags before the drive back to Quito. After lunch we began the process of taking the guests to the airport for their trip back to the UK...
